

### 1.0 Executive Summary

This application for a Certificate of Compliance (COC) relates to locating two single-storey buildings at 142 Broadway, Kaikohe to provide additional office and amenity space for the Kaikohe Police Station.

It is noted that there are existing buildings located along the site frontage with vehicular access from 138 Broadway, Kaikohe (Designation NZP46, Minister of Police). These existing features remain unchanged.

The proposed use is considered to be a permitted activity within the Far North District Plan's ('the FNDP') Commercial Zone.

### 3.0 Description of the Existing Environment

### 3.1. Subject Site

The 'subject site' is 142 Broadway, Kaikohe. The site is subject to a Gazette Notice (Statutory Action reference New Zealand Gazette 1993 p 1031). Refer to **Appendix A** for a copy of the New Zealand Gazette.

The site is located with frontage to Broadway to the south. The rectangular shaped site is flat.

The site is owned and used by the Ministry of Police. The site layout is depicted in **Figure 1** above. The site features two single-storey buildings interconnected by a central hallway; one which aligns the frontage and the other to the rear. Two accessory buildings are located within the rear including an office and a shed. Apart from the shed, all other buildings remain unchanged.

The balance of the site comprises of grassed areas, parking and access which will also remain unchanged. There are no hydrological features on the site.



### 3.2. Site Planning Controls

The underlying zoning of the subject site is the Commercial zone as depicted in **Figure 2** below. Under the Commercial zone the demolition of existing shed is a permitted activity.

The site is also subject to the pedestrian frontage overlay as shown in **Figure 2** above. The existing Kaikohe Police Station building is built up to and aligns the road boundary for the full frontage. As noted, the building within the pedestrian frontage remains unchanged.

The subject site's northern and eastern boundary adjoin Designation NZP46 (Minister of Police) which also forms part of the Kaikohe Police Station.

### 3.2.1. Proposed Far North District Plan

The Far North District Council ('the Council') initiated a review of the FNDP. The Council formally notified a Proposed District Plan ('PDP') in 2022 and is currently within the hearings process for the PDP.

A submission on behalf of the Minister Police sought a rollover of it's designation with amendments to update the legal description and street addresses of their designations. In respect of this, the Minister of Police sought a modification to include both, the subject site



(B) and existing designated area (A) within the designation boundaries as shown in **Figure 3** below. Properties A and B form part of the Kaikohe Police Station. There were no submissions received on the Minister of Police designation.

As part of the Section 42A Report for Designations, the Council has recommended that the designation include properties A and B under the PDP.

The Council will give notices of its decision on the PDP based on recommendations of the hearing panel in 2026. Although it is recommended and anticipated that the designation include the subject site, this does not have legal effect.

### 3.3. Surrounding Environment

The site and neighbouring properties along Broadway are zoned as Commercial as shown in **Figure 2** above. Subsequent properties beyond the alignment of Commercial zoning are zoned as predominantly Residential with an Industrial zoned lot directly northwest of the subject site.

As noted, the subject site and neighbouring property to the northeast form part of the Kaikohe Police Station. The western boundary adjoins two parcels accommodating New Zealand Post, Kiwibank, Kaikohe Machinery and a storage facility.

### 4.0 Description of the Proposal

This application for a COC relates to the proposed removal of the shed to enable the placement of two single-storey relocatable buildings northwest of the existing Kaikohe Police Station. Apart from the shed, all other on-sites features remain unchanged such as the existing buildings, vehicle access and parking.

It is noted that the placement and envelope of each relocatable building is fixed, however the internal layout and fenestration are still yet to be finalised, hence there are to options of the internal layout within the design package, which the applicant will choose at a later stage. The internal layout and fenestration have no effects on the compliance with standards.

This COC application relates to the placement of two-relocatable buildings only. No other activities are proposed as part of this application. Any earthworks that occur in the construction process will be undertaken in compliance with permitted activity standards under Earthworks Bylaw 2019. Earthworks are limited to the installation of pile footings, underground connections, and the footpath.

The applicant will undertake the activities in accordance with the construction noise standards of the FNDP, as set out in 7.7.5.1.8 Noise.

### 5.0 Relevant Rules and Standards

### **5.3. Proposed Certificate of Compliance**

Section 139 of the Resource Management Act 1991 provides that a council, on request, must issue a COC if the activity can be done lawfully on the site without resource consent and the council fee is paid. Once issued, a COC is deemed a resource consent under s139(10) of the RMA.

The proposal to remove the shed on the site is considered to be a permitted activity pursuant to the relevant rules and activity standards of the FNDP.



The proposal to place two relocatable buildings on site is considered to be a permitted activity under 7.7.5.1.

The key aspects of this assessment and that which relates specifically to this application is the proposed placement of the two-relocatable buildings on site. This is discussed below.

The placement or construction of buildings within the Commercial Zone are controlled by Section 7.7.5 Zone Rules for Commercial Zones under Chapter 7 Urban Environment. Section 7.7.5.1 Permitted Activities specifies the zone standards that must be complied with and relevant standards for permitted activities set out in Part 3 of the Plan - District Wide Provisions. **Section 5.2** outlines the compliance with the standards to be complied with and Chapters 12 to 17 under Part 3 of the Plan – District Wide Provisions are not applicable to this proposal.

The extent of earthworks is limited to the installation of pile footings, underground connections, and the footpath. These earthworks are to be processed under Earthworks Bylaw 2019.

Based on the above assessment, it is concluded that the proposed placement of two-relocatable buildings on site, as outlined in this application, is a permitted activity.

### **5.4. Overall Activity Status**

The overall activity status of the works proposed in this COC application is **Permitted**.


### **6.0 Conclusion**

The proposal for the removal of the existing shed and the placement of two-relocatable at 142 Broadway, Kaikohe, is a permitted activity pursuant to the rules and relevant permitted activity standards of the FNDP, specifically those within Chapters 7 Urban Environments and Chapters 12 to under Part 3 of the Plan - District Wide.

Subsequently, it is considered that the issuing of a Certificate of Compliance for the proposed removal of the shed and placement of the two-relocatable buildings is warranted under Section 139 of the Resource Management Act 1991.







- 1. Title and commencement—This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Karekare Beach Shellfish Closed Season) Notice 1993 and shall come into force on the 2nd day of May 1993.
- 2. Interpretation—In this notice, the term:
  - "Shellfish" has the meaning given in the Fisheries Act 1983;
  - "Karekare Beach Shellfish Area" means all those waters lying within an area bounded by a line commencing at the southern end of Karekau Point (at 36° 59.8'S and 174° 28.4'E); thence proceeding generally in a westerly direction to the southern end of Paratahi Island (at 36° 59.8'S and 174° 28.2'E); thence generally in a northern direction to Farley Point (at 36° 59.2'S and 174° 28.1'E); thence generally in a southerly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement."
- 3. Closed season for shellfish determined—There is hereby determined to be a closed season for the taking of all shellfish

within the Karekare Beach Shellfish Area commencing on the 2nd day of May 1993, and expiring within the 2nd day of May 1995.

Pursuant to section 85 of the Fisheries Act 1983, the Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries, after consultation with the Director-General of Conservation, the New Zealand Fishing Industry Board and the Treaty of Waitangi Fisheries Commission, pursuant to sections 85 and 86 of the Fisheries Act 1983, hereby gives the following notice.

- 1. Title and commencement—This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Cheltenham Beach Shellfish Closed Season) Notice 1993, and shall come into force on the 23rd day of April 1993.
- 2. Interpretation—In this notice, the term:
  - "Shellfish" has the meaning given in the Fisheries Act 1983;
  - "Cheltenham Beach Shellfish Area" means all those waters lying within an area bounded by a line commencing at Takapuna Head (at 36° 48.95'S and 174° 48.5'E); thence proceeding generally in a south easterly direction to the eastern most point of North Head (at 36° 49.3'S and 174° 49.7'E); thence generally in a northerly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement."

# The Treaty of Waitangi Act 1975

# State-Owned Enterprises Act 1986

This notice concerns 4 Layton Road, Whangaparaoa, and Maori claims under the Treaty of Waitangi Act 1975.

The land at 4 Layton Road, Whangaparaoa is described in legal terms as all that parcel of land containing 885 square metres, more or less, being Allotment 590, Parish of Waiwera, described on certificate of title 80D/22.

The land was once owned by the Crown. It was transferred to a State Owned Enterprise under section 23 of the State-Owned Enterprises Act 1986.

There is a special notice or "memorial" on the certificate of title for the land which provides that, if the Waitangi Tribunal recommends it, the land shall be resumed by the Crown and returned to Maori ownership (see sections 27A and 27B of the State-Owned Enterprises Act 1986).

The current owners of the land, Mervyn Leith Glogoski and Gloria Janice Glogoski have applied to the Waitangi Tribunal to have this notice removed. This has been done under section 8D of the Treaty of Waitangi Act 1975.

ANY MAORI PERSON WHO CONSIDERS THAT THEY, OR ANY GROUP WHICH THEY BELONG TO, HAS A CLAIM TO MAKE TO THE WAITANGI TRIBUNAL ABOUT THIS LAND, SHOULD SUBMIT THEIR CLAIM TO THE WAITANGI TRIBUNAL BEFORE THE 22ND DAY OF JULY 1993.

Section 6 of the Treaty of Waitangi Act 1975, describes what a claim is. Claims may be posted or sent to the Registrar, Waitangi Tribunal, Seabridge House, 110 Featherston Street, P.O. Box 5022, Wellington.

If no claim about this land is made to the Waitangi Tribunal before the 22nd day of July 1993, then the Tribunal may recommend that the land no longer be liable to be resumed by the Crown and returned to Maori ownership under section 27B of the State-Owned Enterprises Act 1986.
