## Waitangi Day – Rā o Waitangi – is the biggest event held in the Far North attracting thousands of visitors.

Waitangi Day is New Zealand's national day, commemorating the first signing of Te Tiriti o Waitangi. The treaty is the country's founding document with ongoing significance to Aotearoa's identity, history and the relationship between Māori and the British Crown.

During Waitangi Week this year up to 100,000 people are expected to visit the area. Crowds will build from Monday 3 February with Waitangi Day celebrated on Friday 6 February.

To help the week run smoothly, free visitor parking will be available at three sites at Haruru. Free buses will operate each day, shuttling visitors to and from Waitangi. Roads around Waitangi Treaty Grounds will be closed except for residents, exhibitors and emergency services.

## Getting there

To keep roads around Waitangi clear, visitors are asked to access event parking by taking SH11 from Puketona roundabout (SH10 between Pakaraka and Kerikeri). This route takes you directly to carparks and shuttle buses at Haruru. Cars illegally parked at Waitangi will be towed.

## Shuttle buses

Buses will run 3 to 6 February from event car parks at Haruru, starting one hour before events begin and finishing at 6pm. Parking and buses are free.
