

1.0 INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL FEEDBACK

Brady Wild and his family are long-term residents of the Far North District. They own several properties in the area including a property on Okahu Road, Kaitaia, legally described as Lot 10 DP 554104 and Pt Lot 8 DP 135828 (held within one CT, ref. 962760). This property also has a 1/6 share in a jointly owned access lot (JOAL) legally described as Lot 11 DP 135828. The subject site is currently vacant and used for production purposes.

Brady Wild acknowledges and appreciates the work that Far North District Council (FNDC) have put in to developing the Far North Proposed District Plan (PDP).

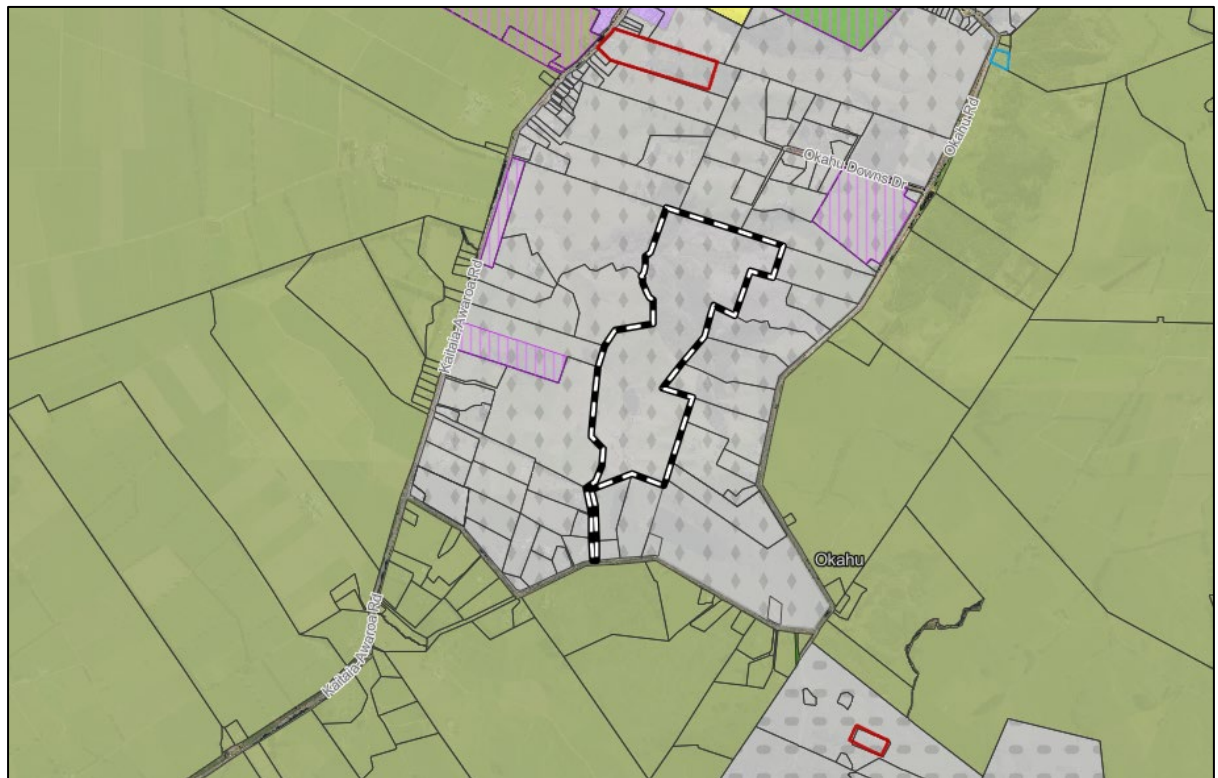


Figure 1: Map showing proposed zoning (Far North PDP Maps)

The subject site is currently zoned Rural Production, and is proposed to be rezoned to Rural Residential as notified in the PDP (**Figure 1**).

In general, Brady Wild supports the PDP. Specific submission points have been outlined in **Section 2.0** below, including the relief sought to improve the PDP.
